Graduation Exercises

The completion of the requirements for a standard diploma, a modified diploma, an extended diploma or an alternative certificate from the public schools is an achievement that improves the community as well as the individual. The Board wishes to recognize this achievement in a publicly, celebrated graduation exercise.

Accordingly, appropriate graduation programs may be planned by the senior class on the date selected by the superintendent or designee.

The district's valedictorian(s), salutatorian(s) or others, at the discretion of the high school principal may be permitted to speak as part of the high school's planned graduation program. All such speeches will be reviewed and approved in advance by the high school principal.

All students in good standing who have successfully completed the requirements for a district high school diploma or qualifies to receive or receives an alternative certificate, an extended diploma or a modified diploma may participate in graduation exercises.

Foreign exchange students are allowed to participate in the graduation exercises.
