Establishment of Alternative Education Programs

The superintendent will develop alternative education programs in compliance with Oregon Administrative Rules and Oregon Revised Statutes:

1. For students who are unable to succeed in the regular programs because of erratic attendance or behavioral problems;
2. For students who have not met or who have exceeded all of Oregon's academic content standards;
3. When necessary to meet a student's educational needs and interests;
4. When a public or private alternative program is not readily available or accessible.

Alternative programs implemented by the district are to maintain learning options that are flexible with regard to environment, time, structure and pedagogy.

Examples of district programs may include:

1. A separate school;
2. Evening classes;
3. Tutorial instruction;
4. Small group instruction;
5. Large group instruction;
6. Personal growth and development instruction;
7. Counseling and guidance;
8. Computer-assisted instruction;
9. Professional technical programs;
10. Cooperative work experience and/or supervised work experience in accordance with the student's educational goals;

11. Instructional activities provided by institutions accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges;
12. Supervised community service activities performed as part of the instructional program; and
13. Supervised independent study in accordance with a student's educational goals.

Students Enrolled in Regular Education

Students may enroll in summer session alternative school to seek credits for classes previously failed in the regular school setting. Credits submitted for course work not previously attempted in the regular school setting will require prior administrative approval and will not generally be granted acceptance in the absence of extraordinary circumstances.

Lack of attendance or lack of timely completion of assigned work may result in a student being dropped from alternative education for the academic year.

Students Enrolled in Alternative Education Only

Students may enroll in a maximum of 10 credits through alternative education during the academic year and a maximum of three credits during the summer term.

Lack of attendance or lack of timely completion of assigned work may result in a student being dropped from alternative education.

The superintendent will develop a procedure for establishing alternative programs.
