

Use of Feature Films/Videos in the School**

Films/videos that have a G rating may be shown at the discretion of the classroom teacher at any grade level.

For Grades K-3 only films/videos rated G may be shown as part of the school program.

For Grades 4-8 only films/videos rated G or PG may be shown as part of the school program. Films/videos with a PG rating must receive approval from the building principal and parents notified** at least two days prior to the showing in a school.

For Grades 9-12 only films/videos rated G, PG, or PG13 may be shown as part of the school program.

Films/videos with a PG or PG13 rating must receive approval from the building principal and parents notified** at least two days prior to showing in a school. In addition, written consent must be obtained from parents prior to showing a PG13 film/video in a school. R rated films will not be shown without written approval from the building principal and school board. As a general rule, R rated films will not be shown in the school.

Instructors are required to preview all media before showing to a student.

A parent may have the opportunity to preview a film/video when practicably possible. Parents have the right at any time to exclude their child from viewing a feature film/video in a school.

Edited or unrated films/videos will be shown at the discretion of the building principal.

**Notification to parents should include the title of the film/video, its rating and the reason for it being shown.
