

### Temporary School Facilities

The Board’s goal is to have sufficient permanent facilities to meet the needs of school enrollment and the school program. Rented facilities, movable units and other emergency school housing may be inadequate for long-term public school purposes.

If circumstances require immediate space which is not available in public school buildings, facilities will be leased and/or movable structures used. Any such facility must conform to all appropriate federal, state and local building and land use codes, health and fire laws and environmental standards, and provisions for accessibility and usability as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.
