

Intradistrict Transfer Students

Attendance areas are established by the Board for district schools. Students are expected to attend the school serving their place of residence unless an option to transfer to another district school has been provided by the district to meet the requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLBA), state law or Board policy. With the superintendent's approval, the district may grant the request of a resident student to attend another school within the Silver Falls School District.

Students who attend a district school identified as persistently dangerous, or who are victims of a violent criminal offense occurring in or on the grounds of the school the student attends, may transfer to a safe public school in the district.

Principals are prepared to assist parents in making an informed choice when an attendance area exception is being considered. This assistance is designed to serve as an act of providing information, not an act to dissuade. Principals will ensure appropriate notice is provided to parents of their right to request a transfer of their student to another school within the Silver Falls School District.

The parent will be responsible for providing transportation for his/her student changing attendance areas for reasons other than those provided by law. Transportation will be the responsibility of the district for all student transfers approved pursuant to the provisions of the NCLBA or state law.

All transfers are subject to annual review and renewal at the discretion of the district, unless the transfer was required by the NCLBA.

The superintendent will develop administrative regulations, as necessary, to implement this policy.
