

Releasing Students from School

Students may be released from school to engage in private instruction with the approval of the superintendent or designee, provided that the student's parent assumes all responsibility for transportation and all liability during the student's absence from school.

Upon application of the parent, a student shall be excused from school for periods for religious instruction as provided by law.

Silverton High School's campus is an open campus at lunch hour for students in grades 9-12 who choose to leave campus for lunch. Students may not use their automobiles during the school day without permission of the school administration. High school students with permission of their parents and school officials may travel to and from other schools and community work experience sites during the school day.

Other than the exceptions noted above, students in grades K-12 shall not leave the school property during school hours without the approval of the principal or designee. Students leaving during the school day are to check out and in through the school office.

A student will not be released to any person without the approval of the parent or as provided in Oregon Revised Statutes.
