

Admission of Resident Students

The following criteria shall guide the admission of nonresident students who have become district residents and are under expulsion from another school district:

1. The district shall deny for at least one calendar year from the date of the expulsion regular school admission to students who are under expulsion from any school district for a weapons policy violation;
2. The district may deny regular school admission to students who are under expulsion from another school district for reasons other than a weapons policy violation. Decisions will be made on a case by case basis by the superintendent. The superintendent may consider any factors he or she determines pertinent to the case. The school or parents may request the consideration of these programs. Parent requests are to be made to the school principal. All requests will be forwarded to the superintendent who will make the final determination. A hearing may be held by the superintendent or his/her designee that includes a review of all pertinent records and factors as well as the questioning of witnesses and/or references. Academic, physical, medical and psychological reports or examinations may be required at the parents' cost;
3. The district may provide alternative programs of instruction to students for a weapons policy violation. Decisions will be made on a case by case basis by the superintendent. The superintendent may consider any factors he or she determines pertinent to the case. The school or parents may request the, consideration of these programs. Parent requests are to be made to the school principal. All requests will be forwarded to the superintendent who will make the final determination. A hearing may be held by the superintendent or his/her designee that includes a review of all pertinent records and factors as well as the questioning of witnesses and/or references. Academic, physical, medical and psychological reports or examinations may be required at the parents' cost;
