

### **Public Conduct on District Property**

No person, including students, staff, members of the public or community members, will:

1. Injure or threaten to injure another;
2. Damage the property of another or of the district;
3. Violate parking regulations;
4. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner;
5. Impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the district's educational program or any other activity taking place on school property which has been authorized by the Board, superintendent, principal or other authorized administrator;
6. Enter any portion of school premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by school officials;
7. Possess, bring or use a weapon as defined in policy JFCJ – Weapons in the Schools;
8. Consume, possess, sell, give or deliver tobacco, unlawful drugs or alcoholic beverages. Possess, sell, give or deliver drug paraphernalia;
9. Wear, possess, use, distribute, display or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang. Use speech or commit any act or omission in furtherance of the interests of any gang or gang activity. A "gang" is defined as a group that identifies itself through the use of a name, unique appearance or language including hand signs, claiming of geographical territory or the espousing of a distinctive belief system that frequently results in criminal activity;
10. Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the Board designed to maintain public order on school property;
11. Smoke or use tobacco products as defined by Board policy KGC/GBK/JFCG - Tobacco-Free Environment;
12. Initiate or circulate a report, one knows to be false, concerning an alleged hazardous substance, impending fire, explosion, catastrophe or other emergency that will take place in or upon a school.

Persons having no legitimate purpose or business on school property or violating or threatening to violate the above rules may be issued a trespass warrant, ejected from the premises and/or referred to law enforcement officials.
