

Student Eligibility for Cocurricular Activities

Students are expected to pass all classes or maintain a 2.0 GPA, with no more than one failing grade, in order to participate in cocurricular activities. Cocurricular activities are defined as athletics, clubs, student government, etc.

If a student drops below the standard at the end of the previous grading period, he/she will be placed on probation for the next grading period. During the probation period the student must pass all classes or maintain a 2.0 GPA, and have good citizenship (good citizenship being defined as no discipline or detention referrals) in order to participate in cocurricular activities.

Probation Guidelines:

Students on probation will:

1. Sign and return to the principal a contract with their parents and/or guardians acknowledging that the district standards for eligibility are a 2.0 GPA, with no more than one failing grade or passing all classes and good citizenship (which means no disciplinary referrals).
2. Be allowed to participate in practice or be involved with planning during the first two weeks of the probation period.
3. Not be allowed to play in athletic contests or participate in “other” cocurricular activities during the first two weeks of the probation period.
4. Have biweekly grade checks and be notified of eligibility standing. If there is not enough evidence for a teacher to provide a grade during the first two week grading period, a teacher may use “acceptable progress” as a standard for a passing grade.
5. If any biweekly check falls below the district standards:
 - a. The student may not practice or participate in any athletic activities, including practice/planning, for the remainder of the trimester;
 - b. The student may not participate in “other” cocurricular activities (i.e. clubs, dances, etc.) during the next two week grade check period.

Dances: Any student attending a district school may attend age appropriate dances regardless of grades. A student may not be allowed to attend dances because of behavior issues.
