College Board Advanced Placement Credit

The College Entrance Examination Board Advanced Placement Program (AP) allows high school students to earn college credit for high school work. Students usually take a high school honors course to prepare for the national AP exams each May. Advanced placement exams are offered in a number of academic disciplines. Credit for these exams is granted under the following conditions:

1. A student must be enrolled at TVCC before AP credit is awarded;
2. A maximum of 12 AP credits may be earned in a specific subject area;
3. A maximum of 24 AP credits may be applied toward a TVCC certificate;
4. A maximum of 45 AP credits may be applied toward a TVCC degree;
5. AP credit is awarded as recommended by the American Council of Education (ACE) guidelines;
6. AP credit is not graded and will not affect the GPA;
7. A student must earn credit at TVCC before AP credit will be awarded;
8. A maximum of 45 nontraditional credits (CLEP, AP, military credit, etc.) from outside agencies may be applied to a TVCC degree or certificate.
