Web Pages

The College encourages the publication of web pages to foster creativity and communication and to provide students a place to demonstrate what they have learned.

All web pages must comply with IIBGB-AR – Web Page Guidelines.

Failure to comply with this policy and applicable administrative regulations will result in discipline, including suspension of College Internet privileges and/or referral to law enforcement, if appropriate.

College Web Site

The College's web site provides a resource for obtaining information about the College and for informing patrons about College programs, activities and Board policies. Requests for publication of information on the College web site should be directed to the webmaster. Administrators/Supervisors may publish web pages as part of the College's web site. Personal information, not related to College programs and activities, will not be permitted.

Staff Web Pages

Staff may create web pages to use in class activities or to provide a resource for other staff members. Staff web pages must reflect the educational goals and objectives of the College.

Staff members linking outside sites to the College server are responsible for checking all material and links prior to submission.

Individual Student Web Pages

Students may, with staff sponsorship, create web pages for publication on the College's web site that are primarily academic, educational and research oriented.

Student work may be published only if related to a class project or other College activity. Such work shall not reveal personally identifiable information or prohibited directory information.

Student-created web pages reflect the individual and do not represent the College. Concerns about the content of any page created by a student should be directed to the appropriate administrator/supervisor.

Student web pages may be removed at the end of the academic year unless special arrangements are made.

Clubs and Organizations

Web pages published by clubs and organizations may provide information about extracurricular and other authorized activities, as well as general information relating to the College.

Others

The College may allow other organizations, including community groups, to publish web pages on the College's web site when such use is consistent with the educational goals and objectives of the College.
