

Financial Aid and Veteran's Affairs Standards of Academic Progress

Students applying for or receiving financial aid assistance at TVCC must meet the following standards in all periods of enrollment to establish and maintain eligibility for financial aid and/or veteran's benefits. The office of the Dean of Student Services monitors and enforces Academic Standards (see IKA – Grading System) independently of the Financial Aid and Veterans' Affairs Standards of Academic Progress.

The Financial Aid and Veteran's Affairs Standards of Academic Progress are monitored and enforced for all aid applicants and aid recipients in all periods of enrollment without regard to an actual offer of or receipt of financial aid monies. Students must meet all general requirements and two standards of academic progress in order to establish and maintain eligibility for federal, state and institutional financial aid.

General Requirements (34 CFR 668.34)

Students must complete Treasure Valley Community College admission requirements.

Students must have a high school diploma, GED or home school certificate. Students cannot be simultaneously enrolled in an elementary or secondary education program.

Students must be enrolled in an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Applied Science, or an eligible one or two year certificate program.

1. GPA Requirement (34 CFR 668.34(a))

Students must maintain a 2.0 quarterly GPA (as computed using a 4.0 scale.);

Students who have attempted 90 college and remedial credits or more must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA;
