

Student Transportation Services

The ESD will coordinate transportation for students enrolled in ESD programs when requested by the districts. The extent of services shall be determined by the dictates of federal and/or state laws or regulations.

Field trips involving transportation of students must be approved by the program coordinator. Aids or assistants that ride a school bus shall receive training on emergency procedures and their role in the safe transportation of all students on the bus.

When students or staff are transported by employees in personal vehicles or ESD-owned vans, vehicles must be insured to a minimum level established by ESD administration, and be properly maintained to assure safety to those transported.

The only people allowed to ride in ESD operated vehicles are the drivers, students enrolled in ESD programs and approved adult volunteers and supervisors.
