

AIDS, HIV and Hepatitis B - Students

The primary goals of this policy are to assure the health and safety of students and the rights of the individual as guaranteed under the constitution and by state and federal law.

School restrictable communicable/infectious diseases.

1. A student with a school restrictable communicable disease as defined by OAR 333-19-015 shall be excluded from the school environment until he/she is no longer afflicted with the condition in a communicable stage and there is no risk of transmission to others.
2. The district may require a certificate from a physician before admitting a student following a diagnosis of a communicable disease.

Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) or any human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) related condition and blood borne hepatitis viral infections.

1. Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), human immunodeficiency virus I (HIV), and blood borne hepatitis viral infections are not school restrictable diseases under the provisions of OAR 333-19-015 or local health department designation.
2. Students afflicted with AIDS or infected with the HIV or blood borne hepatitis viruses shall not be automatically excluded from school.

The superintendent shall develop procedures and guidelines to implement this policy.
